








































































Clare Valley

-northern extension of the Barossa Valley; part of Mount Lofty Ranges zone (designated in 1996) -diurnal temp. changes in summer 100F/60F -Riesling grows on eastfacing slopes next to worldclass Shiraz and Cab

Eden Valley

-eastern extension of the dry and hot Barossa Valley -not a flat valley, but series of hills and slopes -Shiraz in the north, Riesling in the south of valley

 "Australia is on a different Riesling wavelength than the rest of the planet ... Australian Rieslings tend toward austerity, at least compared with those from relatively cool and damp Europe."

Fun Fact: Historically, Riesling was the most widely planted white grape in Australia—much of it destined to become bulk or fortified wine—before getting overtaken by Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, and Semillon.

Riesling Taste Comparison


Clare + Eden Valley


- piercing lime, some white flower, earthy minerality, wet stone in dry wines; lime, apricot, even savory notes in sweeter wines
- as wines age, they become toasty; can age 10-20 years easily

Mosel Riesling

 refreshing acidity alongside flower aromas, honey-crisp apples and pears, stone fruit, minerality, spices, wet stone, occasional green herbs; increasing aromas of honey, honeysuckle, riper stone fruit, exotic fruit, etc. as wines get older/sweeter

"Petrol" or "Kerosene" notes develop quite early in Australian bottles due to higher sun exposure (compared with German or Austrian bottles).





Eden Valley History



Captain Joseph Gilbert migrated from Vale of Pewsey in Southwest England to Australia and established **Pewsey** Vale Vineyard in 1847 (same year as Jacob's Creek in Barossa Valley)


- irrigation was a challenge and grape growing remained limited
- 1950s saw EV's viticulture take off

Eden Valley History, cont'd

- Henschke and Hill-Smith families leaders in Eden Valley/Barossa Valley renaissance away from bulk and fortified wines to high quality table wine
- Henschkes sold their first Riesling in 1868; sent family members to study viticulture in Europe in the 1960's and 1970's -> cold fermentation of white wines
- The Hill-Smith family planted first vineyard in Angaston in 1849, and called it Yalumba ("all the land around"); purchased Pewsey Vale in 1961 and their 1966 Riesling set new benchmark
- Henschke and Yalumba have pushed for higher quality Australian wines and are founding members of Australia's First Families of Wine (2009)







Clare Valley in numbers

- Australian Geographic Indication in 1999
- 4,300 ha/10,625 acres of vineyard area
- vineyards at 1,300-1,800ft
- · moderate continental climate: cold nights, warm to hot days
- annual rainfall: 25 inches, primarily in winter; about 7 inches during growing season
- 11 recognized soil types: terra rosa top soil over . limestone, slate, alluvial spoils, sandy loam, clay, quartz, etc.
- only 1.3% of Australia's total wine production; but 20% of Australia's total Riesling production

Clare Valley History

- · Jesuit priests planted first vines in 1851 at Sevenhill OR European settlers from England, Silesia, and Poland arrived in 1840s, planting vines for personal use
- Initially, the region drew people to sheep farming and gold/copper mining, and only later to commercial viticulture; remained relatively remote and isolated until mid-1900s
- 1983 Ash Wednesday Bushfires burnt over 6,000 ha/15,000 acres in the to-date deadliest bushfire in Australian history





1) Stanley Flat: flattest and

hottest section of CV, due to warm westerlies from Spencer Gulf; mostly Shiraz 2) <u>Sevenhill</u>: center of CV,

- surrounded by woods of eucalyptus trees, whose oils blend with Riesling and
- 3) Polish Hill: freely draining, black slate soil, produces smaller berries; yielding unique zesty minerality
- 4) Watervale: open to Gulf St. Vincent breezes, cooling nighttime temp's,

Clare Valley Riesling to try:


- Jim Barry's Watervale Riesling • which is platinum in color, with "lime flavors, floral, spicy, dense, and weightless" \rightarrow 93 Points (Best Buy \$20) W&S Feb. 2019
- Kilikanoon's Killerman's Run • Riesling with classic lemon/lime notes and green apple finish; a hint of residual RS \rightarrow 90 Points (Best Buy \$20) W&S Feb. 2019
- Jeffrey Grosset's Polish Hill • Riesling grown on slate mined for pool and billiard tables \rightarrow 93 Points (\$52) W&S Feb. '19





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Here are my tasting notes for Pikes "Traditionale" Riesling, Clare Valley, 2017

- □ 100% Riesling
- 🛯 11.5% abv
- Night harvest
- □ Stainless steel, temperature-controlled ferment
- Aromas: Lemon, lime, grapefruit, white flowers, chalk/mineral/wet stone
- Delate: Fresh, crisp, dry; flavors are citrusforward with flowers, minerals, and a hint of "green-fresh" (fresh herbs, lime leaf)
- General Finish: Lingering and crisp, hint of green apple
