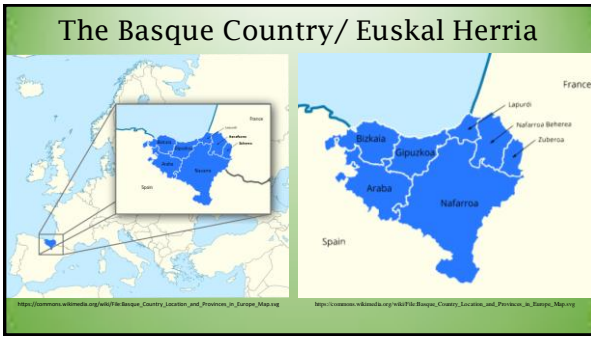

What is Txakolina and Why is it Relevant?

Culture: was traditionally made in the baserri or Basque farmhouse

Grapes: Hondarribi Zuri and Hondarribi Beltza

Denominación de Origen: Bizkaiko Txakolina, Getariako Txakolina, and Arabako Txakolina

Language (Euskara): etymology and origins linked to either the Basque ("etxeke ain"), French, or Hebrew languages

Local Practices: continues to be consumed in gastronomic societies (txokos) as well as other drinking establishments. In the United States, Txakoli Festivals celebrate Basque cuisine from Reno, to Minnesota, to North Carolina
