Napa Valley is itself an AVA, and it has been since it received its own designation in 1981. It is California's first recognized AVA and the second in the United States. Within the Napa Valley AVA exist 16 AVAs, which nested include Atlas Peak and Mt. Veeder.....

The Gateway Pillars to Napa Valley







- Southeast Napa Valley
 - Atlas Peak Appellation is located primarily within the Soda Canyon and Foss Valley areas, northeast of the town of Napa, east of Yountville and above the foothills of the Stags Leap District. Elevation: 2,663 feet, it is the most prominent peak in the region.
- Total Area: 11,400 acres
- Under vine: about 2,000 acres
 - Cabernet Sauvignon (1,000+ acres)
 - Chardonnay (146 acres)
 - Merlot (84 acres)
 - Cab Franc (24 acres)










- Southwest Napa Valley
 - West of Napa and Yountville, within the Mayacamas Range. Adjoins the cool Carneros District. Elevation: 2,550 feet
- Total Area: 16,000 square acres
- Under vine: about 1,000 acres
 - Cabernet S. (540 acres)
 - Chardonnay (76 acres)
 - Malbec (74 acres)
 - Merlot (39 acres)
- Total Production: approx. 40k cases


- Vineyards were first planted on Atlas Peak in 1870, and the area experienced steady growth in vineyard acreage between 1880 and 1901.
- Plantings included:
 - Chasselas, Malvoisie, Burgundy, Zinfandel, Muscat, Flaming Tokay, Mission, and Riesling.
- The first winery was established in the early 1980s
- Atlas Peak growers supply fruit to dozens of wineries in Napa and Sonoma counties, helping to create some of the finest wines in the world
- Established as an AVA in the early 1990s,












- Named for the Dutch Presbyterian pastor, Peter Veeder.
- Known primarily as a resort area the "Napa Redwoods".
 Herman Hudeman owned around 2,500 acres and established a popular resort.
 He did have a small winery and some vineyards.







T R I N C H E R O Jamily Estates



- The Wild West days winemaking on Mount Veeder was first recorded
 - 1864 Captain Stelham Wing presented the first Mount Veeder bottling in the Napa County Fair, a wine hailing from today's Wing Canyon Vineyard.
- The Germanic thread continued with the founding in the 1880's:
 - Streich Winery (today's Yates Family Vineyard)--by Ernest Streich, and the Fisher Winery (today's Mayacamas Vineyards) by John Henry Fisher, of Stuttgart.
- Commercial scale production arrived on Mount Veeder in 1900 when Theodore Geir, a colorful and flamboyant German-born Oakland liquor dealer, bought the property that would later become the Christian Brothers' Mont La Salle Winery--today's Hess Collection Winery.
- By the late 1890's, there were some 20 vineyards and 6 wineries
- Prohibition diminished the vineyards
 - Mayacamas Vineyards in 1941 Jack Taylor (first to plant Chardonnay and Cab S.) Bob Travers - 1974
 - Bernstein Vineyards in 1964. lene and Michael Bernstein, whose 1973
 Cabernet Sauvignon was the first wine to bear the Mount Veeder designation on the label.








The Great Valley Sequence and The Franciscan Formation

- Great valley sequence
- Magma rises to form volcanoes and mountains

Elevation:

- High2,600
- Average 1,504

Low 1,268

Climate:

- Cool, mountain influenced
- About 10–15° cooler than the valley floor in summer;
- Above the fog line, there is low day-to-night temperature range, with summer temperatures rarely rising above 90°
- Rainfall: 38 inches

Soils:

 <u>Heavily volcanic and relatively young geologically</u>. Most of the vines are planted on <u>west facing slopes</u> and get a lot of sunlight until late in the afternoon.

Principal varieties & characteristics:

<u>Cabernet Sauvignon</u>: Bright berry and cherry fruit, and more acidity than wines from Stags Leap District.


<u>Chardonnay:</u> Crisp, floral, aromatic, with distinctive pear-mineral flavors and bright acidity.

Elevation:

High Avera 2,600 1,041

Climate:

- Cool to moderate, with most vineyards above the fog-line, meaning warmer nights and cooler days and less diurnal range than the valley floor. Typical mid-summer high temperatures about 85°F. East-facing slopes - Less Sun exposure
- Rainfall: 35 inches

Soils:

 Sedimentary based, former seabed, shallow and generally well drained, as well as more acidic, with low fertility. Most have a sandy or sandy-loam texture.

Principal varieties & characteristics: Ageability is a hallmark of Mt. Veeder wines.

<u>Cabernet Sauvignon</u>: Low yields give red wines a firm, tannic structure with strong earth-berry aromas and rich.

<u>Chardonnay</u>: minerally, appley, even citrus flavors with med++ acidity.


