

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


World Map & Climate

Four Seasons – North to South



Winter, Niigata Spring, Shizuoka

Fall, Nagano

Summer, Okinawa

Japan is divided into 6 main climatic zones:

Hokkaido: Cool summers, long and cold winters.

Sea of Japan: Relatively cool summers, cold winters with heavy snowfalls.

Central Highland: Large temperature variance between summers and winters, and between days and nights.

Seto Inland Sea: Mild climate throughout the year.

Pacific Ocean: Hot and humid summers, cold winters with little snowfall.

Southwest Islands: Subtropical climate with hot summers, warm winters with high precipitation.



Japanese Whisky History

1854 Commodore Perry's Visit, brought Whiskey

Matthew Calbraith Perry was a Commodore of the United States Navy who commanded ships in several wars, played a leading role in the opening of Japan to the West with the Convention of Kanagawa in 1854.

1923 Suntory founded by Shinjiro Torii

1929 Suntory's 1st Whiskey White was released

1934 Nikka founded by Masataka Taketsuru

1980 Suntory Old hit 144,000,000 bottles

No.1 in the World

2000 Japanese Whiskey Consumption dropped to 20% of 1983

2003 Suntory Yamaazaki won ISC Gold

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Standards for Labeling "Japanese whisky"

<u>On February 16, 2021</u>, the Japan Spirits & Liqueurs Makers Association made an announcement of <u>Standards for Labeling Japanese whisky</u>. The Labeling Standards have been instituted by the association members themselves, as an internal rule to define "Japanese whisky", <u>effective from April 1, 2021</u>.

Term	Production Method Quality Requirements		
"Japanese whisky" (or "Japanese whiskey")	Raw ingredients	Raw ingredients must be limited to malted grains, other cereal grains, and water extracted in Japan. Malted grains must always be used.	
	Production method	Production	Saccharification, fermentation, and distillation must be carried out at a distillery in Japan. Alcohol content at the time of distillation must be less than 95%.
		Aging	The distilled product must be poured into wooden casks not exceeding a capacity of 700 liters and matured in Japan for a period of at least 3 years thereafter.
		Bottling	Bottling must take place only in Japan, with alcoholic strength of at least 40% as of such time.
		Other	Plain caramel coloring can be used.

The background behind setting the Labeling Standards is as follows

"By clearly defining what "Japanese whisky" is and making that information available to the public in Japan and abroad, we <u>aim to</u> <u>clarify the confusing situation for the consumers."</u>



Suntory Whisky History

The history of Japanese whisky is the history of <u>Shinjiro Torii, the</u> <u>founder of Suntory</u>.


Torii was born in 1879, when <u>Western</u> culture & civilization flowed into Japan. Ending his schooling at age thirteen, Torii <u>entered into an</u> apprenticeship at a pharmaceutical wholesaler in Osaka that carried Western liquors. There he <u>mastered techniques of</u> mixing and blending through his teenage apprenticeships.

In the year 1899, Shinjiro Torii went independent, started generations of pursuit of a dream.

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Suntory Yamazaki





The Yamazaki Distillery is Japan's first and oldest malt whisky distillery established in 1923 by Suntory's founder Shinjiro Torii.

Inspired by traditional Scottish whisky, Torii envisioned a Japanese approach by choosing a terrain and climate <u>completely</u> <u>different to those of Scotland to create a</u> <u>unique kind of whisky.</u>

Nestled proudly on the periphery of Kyoto, this region was formerly referred to as "Minaseno", <u>where one of the purest</u> <u>waters of Japan originates.</u>

- Yamazaki is also <u>home to Sen no Rikyu</u>, Master of "The Way of Tea." Located where the <u>Katsura, Uji and Kizu rivers</u> converge, providing a <u>unique misty climate</u> and one of Japan's softest waters.
- The diversity of this region's <u>temperature and humidity creates ideal conditions</u> <u>for cask aging</u>, known as the signature "<u>Suntory Maturation</u>".

Yamazaki Whisky is **Suntory's flagship single malt whisky**, <u>multi-layered with</u> <u>fruit and **Mizunara aromas**</u>.

Today, Suntory Yamazaki is <u>not only the</u> <u>No.1 single malt whisky in Japan</u>, but is <u>enjoyed in more than 35 countries</u>.



HAKUSHU. WHERE INSPIRATION CONTINUES.

The Hakushu Distillery was founded half a century after Yamazaki.

Keizo Saji inherited his father's vision in his quest for innovation and constructed this second Suntory distillery in 1973.

<u>Keizo Saji</u>, the <u>Second Master Blender</u>, inherited his father's quest to push the boundaries of what a Japanese whisky could be. He had <u>searched all over Japan for high</u> <u>quality water</u> that will <u>become the most delicately aromatic</u> to produce whisky that people would love. After searching with tenacity to the headstreams of rivers and <u>deep into</u> <u>rugged mountains</u>, he found <u>Hakushu</u>.

The Hakushu Distillery is <u>without question one</u> of the Highest Distilleries in the <u>World</u>, built amidst the <u>Deepest Forests</u> in the Japanese Southern Alps.


HAKUSHU. WHERE INSPIRATION CONTINUES.



Exceptionally Soft Mountain Water of Hakushu originiates as <u>clear-flowing</u> <u>rainwater and melted snow</u>, which passes through Mt. Kaikomagatake of the Japanese Southern Alps.



With Four Distinctive Seasons, the clear air and cool, humid climate of Hakushu's vast forests allow the distillery, one of the few situated at an elevation of 700 meters or more, to produce high-quality whisky through a slow, unhurried process.



The Majestic Forest that surrounds the Hakushu Distillery shelters an Abundance of Plant Varieties reflecting the many expressions of Japanese Nature.

The malt whiskies born here are <u>simultaneously **blessed** with a very particular</u> <u>microclimate, verdant forests</u>, and <u>water offering</u> a rare softness and purity, <u>only made possible by filtration of rain & snow through thousand-year-old</u> <u>Granite Rocks</u>. © Sake School of America.



The environment at the Hakushu distillery is <u>vastly different</u> to that of the Yamazaki distillery. At fermentation, artisannal craftsmen use solely wooden washbacks to encourage maturation by retaining heat in the cool air at the distillery. A variety of pot stills and casks are carefully chosen to suit the high elevation and climate of Hakushu, ultimately producing an array of single malt whiskies with a variety of characters that reflect its surroundings.

Suntory Single Malt Whisky Hakushu is the <u>fresh and gently smoky single malt</u> whisky with herbal notes that is the revelation of Japanese single malts.

In 2006, the Hakushu won its First Gold Medal at the International Spirits

Challenge; since then it has won numerous awards at the ISC and other major international competitions.

By using a **variety of stills, processes and techniques**, a **wide range** of styles from light to full-bodied are produced.

Nikka Whisky History

- Born into a <u>sake brewing family</u> in Hiroshima in 1894.
- Graduated from Osaka Technical in 1916 where he majored in brewing.
- From 1919 he apprenticed at <u>Longmorn Distillery</u>, <u>James</u> <u>Calder</u>, and <u>Hazelburn Distillery</u>.
- Came back to Japan in 1920 and start working at <u>Kotobukiya</u> (Suntory), worked for 10yrs.
- And Establisehd Dai Nippon Kaju Co. in 1934
- Yoichi Distillery started
 distillation in 1936



Nikka Distillery

At Latitude 43.2° N The harsh and rich nature in the north



Taketsuru valued the <u>climate</u> and <u>natural features of the north</u>.

- Yoichi was close to the sea, surrounded by mountains on three sides and in many ways similar to Highland in Scotland.
- Cold climate with an appropriate Humidity, Crisp Clean Air and Fresh Water - everything necessary for his ideal whisky.
- The proximity to the sea is one of the distinctive features of Yoichi. The <u>Sea Breeze gives a Briny</u> <u>Hint</u> to the whisky <u>during the</u>

<u>Maturation.</u>

The <u>characteristics of</u> <u>Yoichi Single Malt</u> such as <u>boldness</u> and toasty <u>burnt flavors</u> are <u>unique</u> <u>features of this distillation</u>. Direct coal-fired distillation The tradition inherited from the foundation Similar to pot stills at Longmorn Distillery in Speyside where Masataka had the first practical training in Scotland.

This traditional coal-fired distillation is hardly seen today as it is **difficult** to **control temperature** and requires **highly skilled craftsmen**.

However, the distillation process at Yoichi has **remained very traditional** to this day.

Delicate balance between peaty, smoky and fruity aromas

Nikka Yoichi Single Malt ABV: 45%, Price: \$100

- described as **Bold and Strong.** Pleasant <u>peaty notes and smokiness</u> originating from <u>the traditional direct</u> <u>coal-fired distillation</u> as well as a <u>briny</u> <u>hint delivered by the sea breeze</u> during the aging process.

Vatting various different malt whiskies together, this bottling <u>expresses a</u>

delicate balance between peaty, smoky and fruity aromas.

These pot stills are heated by Indirect Steam at a much Lower Temperature that allows Slower Distillation.

This distillation method results in **Soft x Floral** characteristics in <u>Miyagikyo Single Malt</u>. © Sake S Masataka aimed to develop a <u>**COMPlete Contrast between**</u> <u>Yoichi Distillery and Miyagikyo</u> <u>Distillery.</u>

Along with the **different terroir**, the **different distillation method** of Miyagikyo creates **distinctive malt whiskies.**

Miyagikyo's pot stills are much larger than those at Yoichi with different shapes such as a Bulge Neck and Ascending Lyne-arm.

- described as **Soft and Fruity.** Using less peaty malt, this whisky is

distilled in a pot still heated **by Indirect** Steam at a Low temperature.

Estery aromas generated by carefully Selected Yeast strains.

Miyagikyo Single Malt has an <u>elegant</u>
 <u>fruitiness and a distinctive aroma with</u>
 <u>a strong Sherry cask influence</u>.

Sasanokawa is Tohoku Japan's Oldest Sake Brewery founded in

<u>1765</u>- as such, it has a long history of producing small batch craft whiskies for the local area.

- Started producing Whisky from 1946.
- Also produces <u>Shochu, liqueur, other</u> <u>spirits.</u>

- They are also famed for assisting Ichigo Akuto in the launch of <u>Ichiro's Malt</u> <u>whisky line (2004~2008)</u> by holding on to casks from the closed Hanyu Distillery.

Fermentation tank: 4 (3KL) 1st Still: 1 (2KL) 2nd Still: 1 (1KL)



Sasakawa Pure Malt





Light, smooth and soft

Sasakawa Pure Malt ABV: 43%, \$125

- A masterful blend of three different bourbon-barreled whiskies: <u>un-peated</u> malt whisky, a <u>peated</u> malt whisky, and a <u>peated</u> malt whisky <u>finished in</u> <u>Spanish sherry casks</u> after spending five years in bourbon casks.

Color: Light gold Nose: Pear, lemon grass, yeasty Palate: Lemon peel, honey Texture: light, smooth, soft Finish: Refreshing, herbaceous, hint of peaty smokiness hiding beneath sherry savor.
