



1840s -1870s



AUSTRALIA'S OLD-VINE WILLIAM STRALIA'S OLD-VINE







- Vineyards dating back to the 1860s
- A significant amount of old vines (mostly Shiraz) growing on its own roots
- Tyrrell's Wines, which has been Australian-family-owned since 1858, is known for its six 'Sacred Sites' old-vine blocks
- Charles King planted Shiraz in the Old Hill vineyard at Mount Pleasant in 1880, making those vines some of the oldest in the Hunter Valley









- Vines dating back to 1842
- Home to over 2,500 ha of vines over 35 years old and over 250 ha of vines planted before 1910
- Barossa old-vine varieties:
 - Shiraz
 - Mourvèdre
 - Grenache
 - Cabernet Sauvignon
 - Riesling
 - Chardonnay
 - Semillon

CLARE VALLEY



Wendouree Cellars' claim to fame is its prized old-vine Shiraz. First planted in 1893, these dry-grown vines are still producing beautiful fruit today.







- Tahbilk in Nagambie Lakes, the oldest winery in Victoria, boasts the oldest Marsanne vines planted in 1927 and the largest single acreage of Marsanne in the world.
- The famed Nursery Block at Best's Wines in Great Western is believed to hold the most extensive collection of prephylloxera plantings in Australia


 and possibly the world.
- Because of the scarcity of its Pinot Meunier plantings, Best's winery makes this wine only in the best vintages.
- Rutherglen, once a gold mining town, famed for its fortified wines.

"Put simply, epigenetics is the study of the mechanisms that initiate and maintain stable and heritable patterns of gene expression. One key mechanism is **DNA methylation**, the chemical modification of DNA molecules, which influence cell development, including regulation of cell differentiation, and function. Failure of DNA methylation in stressed plants for example, can result in developmental abnormalities. Too much, or too little DNA methylation can engender negative gene expression leading to crop disease.

DNA methylation levels increase with developmental age through to maturity, and can potentially activate or repress genes in response to environmental conditions, for example water stress, nutrition, or chemicals. In people, these processes can potentially lead to cancer, auto-immune disease, mental disorders, and diabetes.

Pewsey Vale The Contours Riesling 2015 – Eden Valley

This site was originally planted in 1847

Riesling was planted in 1961 and the fruit for this wine comes from those original, contour planted vine rows

Grey sandy loam soil site – 500 meters above sea level


Biodynamically farmed


1-4 days on solids pre-fermentation

Natural yeast initiates fermentation


Fermented in stainless steel

Alc 12.5% | pH 3.0 | TA 6.07 g/L









Tyrrell's HVD Old Vine Chardonnay 2017 – Hunter Valley

Sourced from the Hunter Valley Distillery vineyard

Vines were planted in 1908 on sandy loam soils

Hand picked and sorted in the vineyard

Basket pressed then cold settled for 2-3 days

Fermented in stainless steel

Matured for 8 months in 2 and 3 year old French oak

Alc 12.5% | pH 3.45 | TA 6.04 g/L



Approach to Relaxation *Nichon* 2018 – Barossa Valley

90% Semillon 10% Sauvignon Blanc – Semillon vines are 65 years old

Dry grown on sandy soils in the Vine Vale area of the Barossa Valley – organically farmed

Slow basket pressing (12 hours) to gain some skin contact

Barrel fermented in 2 and 3 year old French barriques

Matured for 12 months

Unfined - unfiltered

Alc 12.5% | pH 3.26 | TA 7.88 g/L





Thistledown Vagabond Grenache 2020 - McLaren Vale

From 4 separate, old, dry grown, bush trained vineyards in Blewitt Springs

Deep sand with some ironstone - Hand picked - all wild yeast fermented

70% was fermented in pyramid shaped concrete fermenters with alternating layers of whole bunch and crushed fruit. No extraction method used. Matured in combination of old puncheons and concrete eggs

30% was open top fermented with 35% whole bunch – hand plunged twice daily. Matured in old puncheons

All batched transferred to tank for blending. Bottled without fining or filtration

Alc 14.5% | pH 3.4 | TA 5.90 g/L







Wine 5 John Duval *Annexus* Mataro 2017 – Barossa Valley

From a limited selection of 100+ year old dry farmed vines in the Light Pass area of Barossa Valley

Red brown loam over clay

Hand picked, open to fermented with a small amount of whole bunch

Matured for 15 months in old 300lt French oak

Alc 13.5% | pH 3.55 | TA 7.1 g/L

Wine 6 Bests Bin 0 Shiraz 2019 - Grampians

Produced from the winery's oldest plantings and selected from the lowest yielding blocks of the historic Concongella vineyard at Great Western.

Includes 19th century and mid 20th century plantings of Shiraz



Wine 7

Henschke Mount Edelstone 2016 – Eden Valley

Planted in 1912 by Ronald Angas, descendant of George Fyfe Angas

Deep sandy loam over gravelly clay - underlying geology is over 500 million years old

Ungrafted – dry grown

Fermented in traditional open top concrete fermenters


Matured in French and American oak – 22% new

First bottled as a single vineyard wine in 1952

Alc 14.5% | pH 3.48 | TA 6.57 g/L

Wine 8

Chambers Rosewood Rutherglen Muscat - Rutherglen

Produced from Muscat Rouge a PetitsGrains (Brown Muscat)

Sourced from old vines on the estate picked between 30 – 36 Baume

Very short ferment before fortification with neutral grape spirit

Aged in a type of solera system

Rutherglen level is typically 6 - 10 year old wine

Alc 17.7% | pH 4.08 | TA 4.2g/l | RS 245 g/l


