






DORNFELDER - 6,800ha total, with Pfalz and Rheinhessen -3,000ha each - 7% of German vineyard total - a cross, in 1955, of two previously crossed varieties, it was initially a blending grape to add color - capable of high yields; good disease resistance - juicy, fruit-forward, and good acidity

PORTUGIESER - 2,300ha total, with with ~1,000 each in Pfalz and Rheinhessen - 3% of Germany's total vineyard area - originally from Danube, not Portugal - easy-drinking , fruity red and rosé wines - vineyard area continues to decline

TROLLINGER - 2,000ha across Germany, almost all of it in Württemberg - 2% of Germany's total vineyard area - needs a long time to ripen, but retains high acidity - appreciated for reliable, high yields - KNOWN AS: Schlava or Vernatsch in Alto Adige where grape is thought to originate
