
Sable de Camargue AOC:

A new AOC established in October 2023

Promoted from its previous IGP status

Hugs the Mediterranean Coastline from the Rhône Delta and west

Sable de Camargue AOC

wines and vines

Rosé only (termed *Vin Gris* and *Gris de Gris*)

Principal Varieties (red): Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon, Carignan, Cinsaut, Grenache Noir, Merlot, Marselan, Syrah

Principal Varieties (white/gris): Grenache Gris, Grenache Blanc, Muscat d'Alexandrie, Ugni Blanc, Rolle (Vermentino)

For rosé (vin gris): min. 70% principal varieties (min. 2 varieties)

Gris de Gris: 100% Grenache Gris





First established in 1937, Bordeaux's Entre-deux-Mers AOC is tucked between the Garonne and Dordogne Rivers.



For the first 86 years of its existence, the Entre-deux-Mers AOC was approved solely for white wines.

This changed in August of 2023, as the rules were revised to allow for the production of dry, red wines.







Winters Highlands AVA

Topography: Gentle to steep slopes; includes the northeastern-most foothills of the CA Coast Range

Elevation: I00 feet/30 m to 400 feet/120 m asl

Soil: Moderately well-drained gravelly loam (derived from sedimentary soils) over clay

Climate: Warm days/cool nights

Of 7,296 total acres, approx.

134 are planted to commercial vineyards

Leading red varieties:
Petite Sirah, Tempranillo, Zinfandel, Malbec

Leading white varieties: Chardonnay, Albariño, Verdejo, Sauvignon Blanc

Just a few wineries, including Berryessa Gap Vineyards and Turkovich Family Wines

Long Valley-Lake County AVA

Topography: a long, narrow valley floor—1,322 feet/403 m asl—surrounded by hills

Long Valley Creek runs along the valley floor

Soil: fossilized deposits (known as the Cache Formation) as well as freshwater lake deposits, volcanic rock, tuff, limestone, sand, & gravel

Climate: Winkler Scale Region III

wines and vines

Of 7,605 total acres, approx.

149 are planted to commercial vineyards

Leading varieties: Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Petite Sirah, Syrah

Currently contains 3 wineries, including Noggle Vineyards and Winery, Cache Creek Vineyards and Winery, & Stonehouse Cellars

Thermenregion: classified as a DAC as of May 2023

Thermenregion DAC

Warmer than the surrounding areas: sheltered from Alpine cold by the Wienerwald hills to the west; receives warm breezes from the Pannonian plains (from the east)

Soil: range from sandy loam to pebbles and stones; able to retain heat and good drainage

Long hours of sunshine and dry autumns

Approved for several different styles of wine & a long list of grape varieties


Specifications vary depending on quality level:


Riedenwein (approved single-vineyard) Ortswein (approved single municipality) Gebietswein (region-wide)

Riedenwein approved: Pinot Blanc, Chardonnay, Rotgipfler, Zierfandler, St. Laurent, Pinot Noir

Rotgipfler/Zierfandler (white) blend is a local specialty







Canelli DOCG

Covers 18 communes within the provinces of Asti and Cuneo

Located along a bend of the Belbo River and upwards into the foothills of the Appennines

Vineyard elevation must be between 165 and 500 meters (540 and 1,635 feet) asl

Sandy, chalky, high-alkaline soils

100% Moscato Bianco

Must be hand-harvested

Frizzante (lightly sparkling) with a maximum of 2.5 atmospheres of pressure

"in the style of Moscato d'Asti"


ABV: min. 4.5%—max. 6.5%


RS: typically 8%
